INITIAL License within the Degree Program is available for students who have passed ALL required MTELs in Early Childhood (PK-2), Elementary (1-6), English (5-12), History (5-12), Mathematics (5-8), Physics (8-12) or General Science (5-8).

Students who seek a Master's Degree ONLY will take 4 elective courses (12 credits) in their subject field. These courses may qualify as "Content Area" courses toward a Professional License as part of a Master's Degree.

For students who seek Initial License in other areas, Jenmarc will work with Class Measures to examine alternative routes to Massachusetts Licensure.

PROGRAM INFORMATION

- Classes start in Brockton in mid-September 2019; classes are also available in Quincy
- Complete the MEd degree in as little as 4 semesters or 16 months
- Between 40 and 43 credits required, depending on the concentration area
- Eastern Nazarene College will review all student transcripts to determine applicable transfers
- Financial aid is available for eligible students. Eastern Nazarene College is a participating school partner with the **Federal TEACH Grant program**.*
- 2019-2020 Costs:
 - Tuition: \$515 per credit
 - Fees: \$10 per credit
 - Optional textbook service: \$85 per class
 - Estimated total cost (based on 2019-2020 rates): \$21,000 to \$22,575 tuition and fees (estimated total cost of \$765 to \$850 for the optional textbook program)

Pre-APPLICATION and APPLICATION PROCESS

1. Fill out a PRE-Application Form and return it by email, fax, or snail-mail. (There are NO fees.)
2. Call the Jenmarc office at 508.586.3574 to schedule an interview.
3. During the interview, you will be given specific instructions for completing the application to Eastern Nazarene College.
