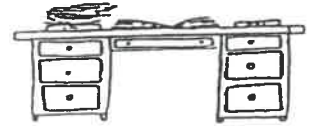

 designed to provide educators with post-Master's study in Education.

This program will begin in the FALL 2017 semester but a student may enroll at any time.
 The CAGS is designed to be completed in one year.

The 30 credit Program is made up of 18 credits (6 courses) in CORE Administration areas
 and 12 credits (4 courses) in a CONCENTRATION.

The Program is priced at \$400 per credit (\$1,200 per course)
 The TOTAL Program cost is \$12,000 with Financial Aid available through CSJ upon acceptance.
