- 1. EDAR 531 Handmade Books in the Inclusion and ELL Classroom Instructor: M. Maloney  
February 21,22,23,24 from 8AM-4PM plus on-line** (This course was last offered in the FA11 semester.)

Course Description:

This course provides the essential ingredients for designing and making books for classroom projects, from simple binding and finishing techniques to complete products. A step-by-step approach to learning the necessary skills will teach participants how to make accordions, pop-ups, meanders, and simple sewn bindings as models to bring back to their classrooms. Suggestions for practical applications of handmade books in multiple curriculum disciplines will be given. Parameters of this course will be adjusted to the level of the student's ability; from those with absolutely no experience, to those with more knowledge on the subject.

- 2. EDHS 556 The Road to the Revolution: History in the Classroom  
Instructor: M. Maloney

Course Description: This course will explore the development and relevance of the American Revolution in the classroom. Through multimedia presentations and reenactments, students will experience the events of pre-Revolutionary and Revolutionary times in a variety of formats. By visiting local historical landmarks in Boston, Lexington/Concord and small group discussions students will understand how to adapt it to their classrooms, emphasizing ELL and Inclusion at all grade levels.
